

FAQ's

1. How unique is the pre-primary "Pre-Cambridge" Curriculum?

2. How well trained are the teachers of the "Pre-Cambridge" Curriculum?

Our teachers are also regular participants in various professional workshops, which not only enhance their knowledge but also keep them updated with the latest teaching methodology. 3. What is the evaluation system followed by the "Pre-Cambridge" Curriculum?

The "**Pre-Cambridge**" Curriculum uses a system of continuous evaluation and provides parents with an assessment of their child's academic progress based on a comprehensive system of reports and PTM's. Teachers' observations and child's participation in the activity tests form the basis of the evaluation.

4. Why parental involvement is an integral part of the "Pre-Cambridge" Curriculum?

Regular meaningful communication between school and home contributes significantly to the success of the school's programme. Parent education programme consists of informing the parent about the learning and the curriculum because learning at school and home should be complimentary.

5. How this International board of education is different from Indian boards of education?

The Cambridge IGCSE curriculum imparts application-based learning and enables critical thinking in students. The teacher acts as a facilitator, who encourages the questioning and discovery method of learning, rather than relying on rote learning. Besides the subjects that are available in Indian board, there are other multiple, flexible options available in International board.

6. Is this system of education new to India?

There are now over 310+ Cambridge schools in India and more than 9000 schools in 160 countries make up the Cambridge learning community world wide.

7. Is this system of education meant only for studies in abroad in future?

No. Both IGCSE and IBDP are globally recognized programmes accredited by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU); an agency that governs all universities / colleges in India. Hence a student from IGCSE (grade 10) or IBDP (grade 12) can study further in India after successful completion. As these programmes are widely recognized, students will get an opportunity to secure placements in world class universities in abroad as well.

8. When are the results of IGCSE declared?

As per the new CIE system, there are 3 assessment sessions (March, May and November) in a calendar year. So, students who wish to apply for Indian universities, need to appear in March session, so that the results are declared in April / May like any other Indian board.

9. How is the academic rigour as compared to Indian boards? If I want to shift my child to an Indian board after primary / secondary education, is it possible?

Yes, it is possible. As the curriculum is age appropriate and the rigour of any subject matter is as equal to any Indian board. At any point in time if you would like to shift the child to Indian board, it is possible and the transition will be smooth.

10. Are the children exposed to electronic gadgets (calculator) at an early age?

No. The assessment rubrics are highly evolved and advanced, hence use of calculator is necessary but limited to when the higher order skills are being tested not the numerical ability of the child.

11. Are the teachers trained to deliver the programme?
